Waterloo Region Developing a Ten-Year Housing Action Plan

Ontario's new Long Term Affordable Housing Strategy requires municipalities to develop 10-year plans to address local housing and homelessness needs. In response, the Region of Waterloo is updating its



housing plan with an emphasis on community consultation and engagement. The first of two community consultations was held on April 17, 2013 in Waterloo, with Martin Buhr and three MennoHomes' Board members participating. The Region expects to have the 10-year plan developed early in 2014.

Just over 3,000 households are on the Waterloo Region's housing waiting list, a number that hasn't changed over the past five years. The actual need is higher, as those in need of affordable

housing often do not bother to register, or give up because of the long waiting period.

In order to better understand the housing needs in the Region and to determine MennoHomes' housing priorities for the next few years, MennoHomes organized briefings from the Region's housing staff. Jeff Schumacher, Supervisor of Housing Supply Initiatives, gave a presentation at MennoHomes' AGM in November 2012, and Deb Schlichter, the Director of Housing, met with the Board of MennoHomes in February 2013.

Government funding for affordable housing is essential. In March 2013, the Canadian Government renewed its commitment of \$1.2B to affordable housing across Canada and the Territories. There is hope that the Ontario Government will match the Federal amount allocated to Ontario.

Research has demonstrated that when decent, affordable and stable housing is provided, the prospects for health, education and employment are improved. Decent affordable housing offers hope for the future.
